	I use the form Workplace/chemical assessment form
	How to find the right waste classification group for the chemicals.
	How and where to dispose safely chemical waste
	I follow the guidelines posted on the chemical cabinets in the cleanroom
	I dispose of HF waste properly in the dedicated waste container
	What to do with a filled waste bin
	 I only use approved waste bins (with safety valve)
	Where to find empty waste bins and plastic bags for trash
	Where to find safety labels, both for marking new chemicals and waste
	How to use the cleanroom with a more sustainable mindset
	What to do with a wipe saturated with solvents
	What to do if I spill chemicals
